

Funding for Year Three

Due to its successes in the initial two years of the project, The West Lancs Challenge has now been funded until March 2014. In its final meeting, the LSP were happy to approve the carry forward of significant cost savings which, together with additional funding provided by West Lancs CVS, will enable a third year of the project to go ahead.

In addition, a donation of £25,000 from the Sir Douglas Glover Trust fund has been pledged. This money will be administered by the Challenge and used to target some specific areas of work. West Lancs Borough Council continues its support for the Challenge project and will shortly be recruiting a part time Business Engagement Officer as well as an apprentice who will both take an important roll in supporting the activity of the project. The Council is also providing £12,000 to support the start of additional apprenticeship placements in the area.

Supported Apprenticeship Scheme YOUng Citizen Finalist

Tuesday 26th March 2013 saw local girl Jennifer Conder, pick up an 'Commended' award on behalf of her YOU Project Team members as a finalist in the High Sheriff of Lancashire's Young Citizen Awards.

As part of the Supported Apprenticeship Scheme, West Lancs CVS and the Partnership Team joined forces to get a group of young people together to work on a community project.

A charity very close to Jennifer's heart is Myeloma UK and the group agreed to focus their efforts on raising funds and awareness for this very worthwhile cause. The team engaged with local business and orchestrated the "Go Orange" event which they ran in October at the Concourse Shopping Centre in Skelmersdale. The event raised over £1800 and Myeloma UK have now adopted the concept as part of their national fund raising campaign. On receiving the award, Jennifer said, "The Big Lottery funded YOU project has been a fantastic experience that has increased my personal confidence and motivation, as well as giving our group the chance to help many people who suffer with Myeloma. They were able to meet representatives from the college, other training providers and employers, all in one location. It was an excellent networking opportunity and very positive feedback was

received from those attending. There was a free prize draw for those attending and one lucky young person won an IPOD.

Passport holders transform local Scout Headquarters in Lathom

A group of unemployed young people from Ormskirk and surrounding areas have rolled up their sleeves to help the local community and refurbished the inside of the 30th District Scout HQ in Lathom.

Young people completing the Prince's Trust Team programme with West Lancashire College sign-up to the Challenge Passport. This helps give them the skills and confidence to find a job through activities such as helping in the local communities, fundraising and practical work; building their skills to help them attain their ambitions.

The 13 young people have been working on the Scout HQ for two weeks and have cleaned the building and surrounding area, painted the main hall, corridors and entrance hall as well as planting bulbs in the garden area at the front of the building. Funds were raised by bag packing in Morrison's Ormskirk on Monday 25 March, allowing them to purchase the supplies needed for the development.
