



West Lancs Dementia Action Alliance

A Dementia Action Alliance is being formed in West Lancs to bring together regional and local organisations to improve the lives of people with dementia in the borough. There are over 850,000 people living with Dementia in the UK, with this number set to rise to one million by 2025 and 2 million by 2050. Here in West Lancashire, there are 1564 people living with Dementia.

The Alliance will be the local vehicle to develop dementia friendly communities. This is defined as a city, town or village where people with dementia are **understood, respected and supported**, and **confident they can contribute to community life**.

There are already over 275 Dementia Action Alliances (DAA's) across the country, all working to support their local areas.

DAA's are formed with the support of charities, councils, and NHS bodies, but equally should include local stakeholders from schools, colleges and universities, to community groups such as Rotary and U3A, from care homes and care providers, to high street businesses like supermarkets, banks, pubs and local transport services.

The purpose of the alliances is to provide the forum for organisations to come together and collaborate on key actions and priorities. including keeping members informed, providing members with support and training, and developing way the carers and people living with dementia are included in decisions for the future.

CUPPA research project

CUPPA (Culture & Understanding Positive Physical Activity) is Edge Hill University's exciting new research project which is exploring ideas and beliefs around physical activity in different cultural groups.

It is hoped that the information gathered will give greater insight into activity trends in different ethnic minorities and highlight what type of health interventions might be most effective. At the heart of the project is the belief that solutions to issues lie within communities themselves.

The CUPPA project is looking for participants from ethnic minorities to help with our research, and are approaching selected organisations. They are looking for participants from **diverse cultural backgrounds**, living in **Lancashire**, who are **over 18**.

Anyone taking part in the project will be asked to talk about what physical activity means to them. They will be invited to attend 3 meetings with a researcher, wear an Activity Monitor for 7 days and participate in a relaxed interview or focus group. Their involvement in the project will be fully confidential.

As a thank you for taking part individuals will receive a £10 shopping voucher, plus an insight into their own activity levels. They can also provide tailored feedback for community groups at the end of the research.

'Make the Call, Don't be a Bystander' Campaign

The West Lancashire Community Safety Team has developed the domestic abuse campaign 'Make the Call, Don't Be a Bystander' in partnership with the Liberty Centre and Edge Hill University Students Union. The campaign was developed and designed following recommendations from a Domestic Homicide Review in Wigan which involved two young ex West Lancashire residents.

'Don't be a bystander' was launched in November 2016, helped by the Mayor of West Lancashire, Liz Savage and Police and Crime Commissioner, Clive Grunshaw. It had a strong social media focus and was supported by television presenter Charlie Webster who is a passionate and outspoken women's rights campaigner, specifically on sexual and domestic abuse. With her support and support from other high profile organisations including Women's Aid, the **campaign reached 400,000 people in its first week via Twitter.**

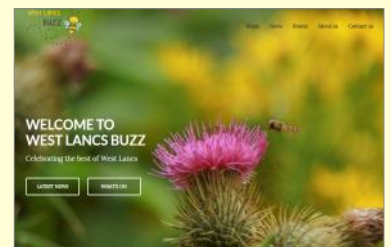
