Community Food Growing in West Lancashire

New allotment site planned for Skelmersdale


West Lancs Borough Council has been working with Lancs County Council to create a new allotment site as part of a housing development planned for Barnes Road, Skelmersdale. Following an initial suggestion from West Lancs Allotment Federation back in 2011 and early development work by CVS Community Food Growing project, the Borough Council has been in discussion with the County Council to develop the site.

The Council is now in the process of finalising the design details of the new site which will contain a minimum of 12 plots of around 150 sq m - each with their own shed. There will be a water supply to the site, and a small community building which will contain a community room, storage cupboard, kitchenette and toilet. It is also hoped that an area around the community building can be used as a community orchard.

It is unlikely that the site will be ready in time for the growing season this year, but plots will be allocated later in the year to be occupied early in 2020.

If you want to register your interest in having a plot on the site please email your contact details to: paula.campbell@westlancs.gov.uk Those on waiting lists elsewhere in Skelmersdale will have preference on the waiting list, as will those in the immediate vicinity of the site, but anyone in Skelmersdale will be able to register an interest.

The Council will keep us informed as this scheme develops and an update on progress including a finalised plan of the new site will feature in a future Dig In edition.

Elswick Community Garden

Elswick Community Garden in Skelmersdale was officially opened by Mayor Noel Delaney and Mayoress Ann Stubbert recently. The garden was the brainchild of Cllr Maureen Nixon, and has grown from 5 fruit trees and fruit bushes to a landscaped area with raised beds at varied heights to be used by the whole community in Tanhouse.



After fundraising for the materials for the raised beds, topsoil and gravel, the Prince's Trust team, based at West Lancashire College offered to turn the plans (developed by the Groundwork Trust) into reality. Prince's Trust tutors and six team members worked tirelessly to get the job done. The team also did their own fundraising for the project and sourced the wood for the raised beds, as well as the topsoil.

Cllr Claire Cooper says, 'Without the help and hard work of the Prince's Trust team, the Elswick Community Garden Project would still be just fruit trees. Now we have an area that all the residents can use and enjoy. We've had so many positive comments from the community and we're looking forward to growing our own vegetables and fruit to share with them using the [Incredible Edible](#) model'. The next stage of the project is to install a garden bench in memory of Yvonne Harrison who had nurtured the fruit trees.

Thanks also go to Tanhouse Action Group for the small raised beds, and West Lancashire Borough Council and Lancashire County Council who provided community funds towards the garden.

The West Lancs Community Food Growing Project aims to get more people involved in growing their own food and eating more healthily. We are working with local communities and schools to set up community food growing initiatives and providing help in finding the land (and funds) that might be needed. **We are keen to hear from anyone interested in growing their own food with others in West Lancs.
