

Potato Day 2020

Don't miss the first Potato Day of the decade! West Lancashire Allotments Federation (WLAFF) is holding its eighth annual Potato Day this Saturday 1st February 2020 between 10am-3pm at the Skelmersdale Concourse Shopping Centre, WN8 6LE.

For many of us, the Potato Day marks the start of the allotment year, and it's an event not to be missed!

Potato Day customers are able to choose from over 100 varieties of potatoes - many of which can't be found in the shops. Also available will be seeds, onions, garlic, soft fruit bushes and fruit trees and the chance to discuss all things related to growing with members of the West Lancashire Allotment Federation (WLAFF). The event has been organised in conjunction with Brighter Blooms Nursery of Preston.

WLAFF are looking for volunteers to help on the day, so if you could lend a hand it would be greatly appreciated! The children worked together to bake apple pies and then between them organised a December Pie and Patter event, inviting older members of the Westhead community to come and enjoy eating the pie with them.

Appley Bridge allotments celebrate grant




New Barnes Road allotment site - update

As reported in previous Dig In editions, a new 12 plot allotment site is being planned in Skelmersdale as part of the new housing scheme at Barnes Road.

The development is progressing, with West Lancs Borough Council working with Lancs County Council to finalise details and planning approval has recently been secured. However due to delays in engaging the developer for the site, the Council is now not expecting the new allotment site to be ready until Spring 2021.

Recycling garden tools trains prisoners

An interesting new national project is equipping the next generation of gardeners, teaching prisoners new skills and reducing waste all at the same time. The Tools Shed project from the Conservation Foundation repairs broken or unwanted garden hand-tools and gives them free to local schools and community volunteers to help create and maintain green spaces. The tools are refurbished in prison workshops, providing training for prisoners and supporting them in finding occupation post-release.

'We officially became organically certified by the Soil Association back in July, but we recently had our latest inspection. I'm pleased to say we didn't have any compliance issues and the inspection went perfectly. The Soil Association organic symbol can now be proudly displayed on all our labels and boxes.'
