Since the launch of the West Lancashire Challenge in July the CVS has issued Passports to a number of local people who have expressed a wish for



support to overcome barriers to work, volunteering and learning. Each of the Passport Holders has been linked with a mentor and together they have worked out a development plan which identifies short, medium and long term goals.

Even this early on in the programme, we have already seen some excellent results. Several Passport Holders have begun courses with West Lancashire College, Learn Direct and Lancashire College. We are expecting at least 1 person will start paid work by the end of this month and another has commenced voluntary work with a view to increasing their hours over the coming weeks.

All of these are positive signs that, with a will to succeed, coupled with the guidance and support offered by their mentors, residents of West Lancashire are up for the Challenge.
